ISLAMIC SCHOOL HOUSING SITE— NEW APPLICATION NEEDED

Rushcliffe Borough Council have confirmed that their planning application made some three years ago for a housing development on the former Islamic School has run out of time, and a new planning application will have to be submitted to them. The original application called for permission for up to 80 new dwellings to be erected.
